Introduction

"Knowledge is power; Information is liberating; Education is the premise of progress in every society, in every family" Certainly, Education is the basic building block of every society. It is the single best investment through which countries can build prosperous, equitable and healthy society as education forms character, strengthens mind, increases knowledge, makes the people independent and dispels ignorance. Education is the process of transformation of knowledge through Teaching and Learning. Teaching and learning go hand-in-hand in the process of education.

The most important component of Teaching and Learning is students, as all the activities and the whole process is centered and planned around him.

A.V.C.College's aim is not just to educate the students, but it aims at creating good students who can become as winning personalities. Our college follow teacher-student relationship system which fosters a good bond between teachers and students; The students are molded under the guidance of their mentors; The teachers inculcate all good habits and personality traits.


Our college periodically evaluate such system through an opinion survey in which students' satisfaction about Teaching and learning is assessed. During 2020-21, an online survey is conducted in order to evaluate the level of student satisfaction upon teaching and learning attributes as detailed below:

- 1. Coverage of syllabus.
- 2. Teachers' preparation for the classes
- 3. Teachers' ability to communicate

- 4. Teachers' approach to teaching
- 5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process
- 6. Discussion of performance in assignments
- 7. Teachers' Interest in promoting Internship
- 8. Facilitating cognitive, social and emotional growth
- 9. Opportunities to learn and grow
- 10. Inform about expected competencies, course and programme outcomes
- 11. Follow-up
- 12. Illustrate the concepts
- 13. identification of strengths and encourage to accept challenges
- 14. Identification of weaknesses and help to overcome.
- 15. Institution's effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement
- 16. Use of Student-centered methods
- 17. Encouragement to engage in extracurricular activities
- 18. inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills
- 19. Use of ICT tools
- 20. Overall Quality.

Queries about all these 20 attributes are measured in terms of Highly satisfied to Not satisfied five scaling parameters. All these parameters for every query are varied according to the nature of the queries.

Students' satisfaction on all these attributes is analyzed in terms of Discipline, Session, programme and overall satisfaction. The following diagram shows the model of Students' satisfaction Analysis.

From the above survey table, it is known that 41.33% of the students have stated that the teachers covered the syllabus almost 85% to 100%, very few students i.e 1.66% only opined that it is below 30%.

Similarly, in regard with Class preparation of the teachers, 55.51% of the respondents replied that it is satisfactorily to them whereas 36.43% marked that it is 'Thoroughly' and just1.58 percentage have said they won't teach at all.

As far as the queries on teachers' ability to communicate is concerned, "it is always effective" as responded by majority of the students (55.58%). At the same time low scale of the responses such as 'very poor' and 'generally ineffective' scored very less percentage of 2.56% and 2.34 respectively.

Also, the teacher's approach to teaching is described as "Excellent by 39.74% of the students, it is "Very good" as stated by 31.6% of the students, small percentage i.e., 1.89% of the students responded that it is poor.

According to the survey, 48.34% of the UG students have said that the internal evaluation process by the teachers is always fair, 34.54% of the respondents have stated that it is usually fair. But only very few percentage i.e.0.45 % and 5.28 % of the students have opined that it is usually unfair and fair.

Also 49.32% of the students felt that the teachers discuss with students every time about their performance in assignments since it would be the high motivation to the students to perform their future assignments with utmost care and perfection. Only 3.17% of the respondents have dissatisfied with this aspect.

In the survey, opinion about how far the department shows active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for the students is obtained. It is found that 53.7% of the student highly satisfied and they opined that the institute regularly takes active interest in organizing field visit and promoting internship. But 5.35% of the students felt that the institute never shows such interest.

As far as the teaching and mentoring process of the institution and how far it facilitates cognitive, social and emotional growth of the students, 42.16% of the students are satisfied as it is found to be very well, 38.76% have stated that it is significant, 13.27% said it is moderate and 2.94% opined not at all.

It is obvious that 43.89% of the students strongly agreed and 37.18% of the students have agreed about the query on multiple opportunities provided by the department to learn and grow. But advantageously, only 0.83% and 4.07% of the students disagreed and strongly disagreed.

Similarly, majority of the students (49.25%) have opined that every time, the teachers inform the students about their expected competencies, course outcomes of the courses that they have studied and the programme outcomes that they are pursuing.

Mentor is a person who teaches or gives help and advice to the younger generation students. According to the survey, majority of the students (46.08%) have stated that the mentor every time takes a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to the students, 32.2% of the students have said that it is usually but only 3.17% of the students replied that they don't have a mentor. It is a favorable remark of the institution that 51.73% of the UG students have said that every time the teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. Majority of the students felt that the teachers fully and reasonably identify the strengths of the students and encouraging the students by providing the right level of challenges.

Majority of the students felt that the teachers every time(50.38%) and usually (28.81%) identify the students' weaknesses and help the students to overcome them.

From the survey, it is understood that majority of the students have strongly agreed(42.91%) and agreed (38.54%) i.e. highly satisfied and satisfied with the institution's effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process through regular tests, assignments and project work of the students. It is the promising feature of the college as only 1.43% of the responses have been recorded under the option of strongly disagreed and 2.79% disagreed about this attribute.

50.53% of the respondents opined that to a great extent, the institute or the teachers in the department use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences. The institute adopts case study, group discussion, Role play, interrogative sessions, class quiz etc., which enhances the student centric method of learning.

At the same time, Students give overwhelming response (48.42-strongly agreed; 31.98%-agreed) about that the teachers' encouragement to the students to participate in extracurricular activities, which was evidenced by the students' records and achievements in fine arts, sports and other activities.

51.51% of the students have said that it is to a great extent and 30.92% of the students felt that it is moderate of the efforts made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and

employability skills to make the students ready for the world of work, which is also evidenced by the students' placements in various reputed institutions and the employers' appreciations.


41.7% of students appreciated that above 90% of the teachers use ICT tools whereas 27.15% of the students opined that 70-89% of the teachers use ICT tools as the teachers also thought that the Use of power point slides or videos will be highly useful for making the students to understand the vague concepts easily.

It is a major highlight that majority of the students (51.06%) strongly agreed and highly satisfied about goodness and quality of overall teaching and learning aspects.

From the above table, It is observed that Majority (38.92+40.12%=79.04%) reported 70–100% coverage of the syllabus. Only 3.59% expressed that it is less than 55%. In regard with preparedness of the teacher, the PG students opined that Most teachers were either "Thoroughly" (36.53%) or "Satisfactorily" (56.89%) prepared. A small percentage (3.59%) felt the teachers were poorly prepared or indifferent.

Teachers are "Always effective" (65.27%) or "Sometimes effective" (23.35%) in their communication. In concern with Teaching Approach, most of the students described the approach as "Excellent" (42.51%) or "Very good" (37.72%). About the fairness in evaluation, Majority (89.22%) found the evaluation "Always" or "Usually fair." A small group (10.78%) felt it was unfair or usually unfair.

In regard with performance feedback, the PG students thought that their performance in Assignments were discussed either "Every time" (49.1%) or "Usually" (34.13%). More than 50% of the students opined that the institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities forstudents is Regular (52.69%) in order to provide experiential opportunities to them.

PG Students opined that the teaching and mentoring process of the institution facilitates their cognitive, social and emotionalgrowth "Significantly" (40.12%) or "Very well" (38.32%). Majority either "Strongly agree" (42.51%) or "Agree" (40.12%) on learning opportunities in the institution. Teachers inform students "Every time" (47.9%) or "Usually" (37.13%) about the students expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.

As far as Mentor Follow-up is concerned, PG students opined that it is "Every time" (49.7%) or "Usually" (34.13%). In regard with the interrogation on IllustrativeTeaching, more than 50% of the PG students opined that the teachers illustrate concepts "Every time" (53.29%) or "Usually" (33.53%). 55.09% of the students opined that the teachers identify their strengths and encourage them with providing right level of challenges "Fully" or "Reasonably" (32.34%).

Opinion about identification and addressing of students Weaknesses by the teachers is that "it is Every time" (49.7%) or "Usually" (36.53%). Mostof the students agreed (84.43%) the institution actively involves students in continuous quality improvement.

Student-Centric Methods such as Experiential and participative teaching methods are used "To a great extent" (47.31%). 51.5% of the students Strongly agreed or Agreed (32.93%) with teacher encouragement for Extracurricular Activities.


Efforts made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world ofwork is "To a great extent" (46.71%) or "Moderately" (42.51%). About the ICT Tools Usage, High usage of ICT tools, with 73.06% reporting above 70% usage by teachers.


The Overall Teaching Quality is Strongly agreed (49.1%) or Agreed (39.52%) that teaching quality is very good.


The above table provides the results of a Student Satisfaction Survey on the Teaching-Learning Process conducted for the academic year 2023-24. It contains 20 questions, each analysing a specific aspect of the teaching and learning process. Multiple response options for each question and their respective percentages are shown in the table. The following are the key observations of such table;

- 1. **Syllabus Coverage**: A majority of students (41.18%) reported that 85-100% of the syllabus was covered, while 39.37% indicated 70-84% coverage.
- 2. **Teacher Preparedness**: Most of the students (56.56%) found teachers to be satisfactorily prepared, and 34.69% felt they are thoroughly prepared for the classes.
- 3. **Teacher's ability to communicate**: 54.6% believed that the teachers' communication is always effective, followed by 25.04% who found it sometimes effective.
- 4. **Teaching Approach:** 40.27% of the arts Students rated it as excellent, and 33.03% of them rated it as very good.
- 5. **Fairness in Evaluation:** 46.46% of the Arts students believed that the internal evaluation is always fair to them.
- 6. **Discussion with students about their Performance in Assignments**: 48.11% reported that their performance in assignments was discussed every time.

- 7. **Internship and Field Opportunities**: 53.54% of the students belongs to arts courses noted that the promotion of internships and field visits by the institute is "regular".
- 8. **Facilitating cognitive, social and emotionalgrowth.** 44.49% felt the teaching and mentoring process of the college "significantly "supported the arts students in their **cognitive, social and emotionalgrowth.**
- 9. **Provision of Multiple Opportunities to Learn:** 42.84% strongly agreed that the institution provided multiple learning opportunities.
- 10. **Informing about expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes:** 47.36% of the Arts students opined that the Teachers informed students every time about expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes
- 11. **Follow-Up by Mentors:** 45.7% indicated that mentors followed up on assigned tasks "every time".
- 12. **Concept Illustration:** 50.08% of students reported that to illustrate concepts, teachers used examples and applications "Every time".
- 13. **Encouraging Strengths:** 51.58% believed teachers "**fully**" identified their strengths and provided appropriate challenges.
- 14. **Addressing Weaknesses:** 49.92% noted teachers "always" helped the students to overcome their weaknesses.

- 15. **Student Engagement:** 42.38% "strongly agreed" about the institution's efforts to engage students in monitoring and improving the teaching-learning process.
- 16. **Student-Centric Methods:** 49.32% of the Arts students felt that teachers "extensively" used experiential and participative learning.
- 17.**Encouraging participation in Extracurricular Activities:** 48.11% "strongly agreed" about that the teachers encourage the student's participation in extracurriculars activities.
- 18. **Skill Development:** 49.62% noted "significant" about theefforts made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world ofwork.
- 19. ICT Usage: 36.65% students observed over 90% use of ICT tools by teachers.
- 20. **Overall Quality:** 50.23% strongly agreed the overall teaching-learning process is very good. In concern with all interrogations of teaching and learning process, arts students positively perceived about the most of the attributes of the Institution's teaching and learning process.

From the above survey table, it is known that 40.96%% of the students have stated that the teachers covered the syllabus almost 85% to 100%, very few students i.e 1.2% only opined that it is below 30%.

Similarly, in regard with Class preparation of the teachers, 54.94% of the respondents replied that it is satisfactorily to them whereas 37.83% marked that it is 'Thoroughly' and just1.45% have said they won't teach at all.

As far as the queries on teachers' ability to communicate is concerned, "it is always effective" as responded by majority of the students (58.31). At the same time low scale of the responses such as 'generally ineffective' and 'very poor' scored very less percentage of 2.41% and 2.05% respectively.

Also, the teacher's approach to teaching is described as "Excellent by 39.88% of the students, it is "Very good" as stated by 31.69 of the students, 1.45 % of the students responded that it is poor.

According to the survey, 50.84% of the science students have said that the internal evaluation process by the teachers is always fair, 33.37% of the respondents have stated that it is usually fair. But only very few percentage i.e.4.34% of the students have opined that it is unfair.

Also 50.24% of the students highly satisfied with the teachers with reference to their discussion with students about the performance in class assignments since it would be the high motivation to the students to perform their future assignments with utmost care and perfection. Only 1.93% of the respondents have dissatisfied with this aspect.

In the survey, opinion about how far the department shows active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for the students is obtained. It is found that 53.61% of the students highly satisfied and they opined that the institute regularly takes active interest in organizing field visit and promoting internship. But 4.7% of the students felt that the institute never shows such interest.

As far as the teaching and mentoring process of the institution and how far it facilitates cognitive, social and emotional growth of the students, 39.52% of the students are satisfied as it is found to be very well, 39.88% have stated that it is significant, 15.06% said it is moderate and 3.25% opined not at all.

It is obvious that 44.46% of the students have strongly agreed and 35.78% of the students agreed about the query on multiple opportunities provided by the department to learn and grow. But advantageously, only 0.72% and 4.1% of the students disagreed and strongly disagreed.

Similarly, majority of the students (50.48%) have opined that every time, the teachers inform the students about their expected competencies, course outcomes of the courses that they have studied and the programme outcomes that they are pursuing.

Mentor is a person who teaches or gives help and advice to the younger generation students. According to the survey, majority of the students (47.11%) have stated that the mentor every time takes a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to the students, 32.53% of the students have said that it is usually but only 2.65% of the students replied that they don't have a mentor.

It is a favorable remark of the institution that 53.37% of the students have said that every time the teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. In fact, Majority of the students felt that the teachers fully and reasonably identify the strengths of the students and encouraging the students by providing the right level of challenges.

Majority of the students felt that the teachers every time and usually identify the students' weaknesses and help the students to overcome them.

From the survey, it is understood that majority of the students have agreed and strongly agreed i.e. satisfied and highly satisfied with the institution's effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process through regular tests, assignments and project work of the students. It is the promising feature of the college as only 1.33% of the responses have been recorded under the option of strongly disagreed and 3.25% disagreed about this attribute.

50.84% of the respondents opined that to a great extent, the institute or the teachers in the department use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences. The institute adopts case study, group discussion, Role play, interrogative sessions, class quiz etc., which enhances the student centric method of learning.

At the same time, Students give overwhelming response (49.28%-strongly agreed; 31.57%-agreed) about that the teachers' encouragement to the students to participate in extra -curricular activities, which was evidenced by the students' records and achievements in fine arts, sports and other activities.

52.05% of the students have said that it is to a great extent and 31.45% of the students felt that it is moderate of the efforts made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make the students ready


for the world of work, which is also evidenced by the students' placements in various reputed institutions and the employers' appreciations.

45.54% of students appreciated that above 90% of the teachers use ICT tools whereas 26.14% of the students opined that 70-89% of the teachers use ICT tools as the teachers also thought that the Use of power point slides or videos will be highly useful for making the students to understand the vague concepts easily.

It is a major highlight that majority of the students (51.33%) strongly agreed and highly satisfied about goodness and quality of overall teaching and learning aspects.

Similarly, in regard with Class preparation of the teachers, 49.18% of the respondents replied that it is satisfactorily to them whereas 39.67% marked that it is 'Thoroughly' and just 2.62% have said they won't teach at all.

As far as the queries on teachers' ability to communicate is concerned, "it is always effective" as responded by majority of the students (59.34). At the same time low scale of the responses such as 'generally ineffective' and 'very poor' scored very less percentage of 1.31% and 2.95% respectively.

Also, the teacher's approach to teaching is described as "Excellent by 43.61% of the students, it is "Very good" as stated by 32.13% of the students but only 2.62 % of the students responded that it is poor.

According to the survey, 52.13% of the Day session students have said that the internal evaluation process by the teachers is always fair, 29.84% of the respondents have stated that it is usually fair. But only very few percentage i.e.5.25% of the students have opined that it is unfair.

Also 55.08% of the students highly satisfied with the teachers with reference to their discussion with students about the performance in class assignments since it would be the high motivation to the students to perform their future assignments with utmost care and perfection. Only 2.62% of the respondents have dissatisfied with this aspect.





Teaching Quality

Many Students praise the teaching quality, mentioning it as "excellent," "superb," and "very helpful." Teachers are highly recognized for their close and decent relationship with students, motivational speeches, and friendly Approach

during hard situations. These praising words are the real gifts to the dedicative teachingfaculties of the institution.

Nature Friendly Environment

In the table of comments, it can be seen that Some responses reflect appreciation for the college's emphasis on promoting green spaces by sapling planting and upkeeping of variety of trees enhancing the quality of Natural Life in campus.

• Better Infrastructure

Positive remarks about the college's infrastructure include the statements of "very nice" and "well-maintained" learning environment, etc exhibits their satisfaction about the infrastructure.

PracticalKnowledge and skill Development

Numerous responses highlight how teachers help students in gaining practical knowledge and skills. Staff members are commended for their encouragement and for creating an engaging classroom experience. They have highlighted that their communication skills are increased with the help of College Curriculum, manifold competitions, Field visits and project report preparation and other activities and mentioned that these are effective in fostering student growth.

• Conducive Atmosphere

Many students described the college is as a "peaceful environment," "great place to learn," and nurturing a sense of pride and belonging. This points to a supportive and welcoming campus culture.

Holistic Development Opportunities

Feedback highlights the importance of extracurricular activities and positively expresses that the college maintains a good balance of academics and cultural or skill-building opportunities. Beyond academic excellence, severalstudents' express satisfaction with co-curricular and extracurricular activities (such as Sports, NSS, NCC, RRC, LEO Club, Fine Arts, PEKAK Magazine, Student Magazine Ilanthoodhu, Plumes etc., Field study and project-based learning opportunities) have left a positive impact on them especially developing leadership skills, Oratorical and poetry writing skills. The students highlighted the institution's efforts in maintaining discipline while encouraging participation in extracurricular activities, sports, and other skill development programs.

Expressions of satisfaction by their statements like "Excellent," "Very good," "Awesome," and "I think this is the best college" highlights the general sentiment of their satisfaction. Many students mentioned 'feeling proud of their association' with the institution.

In overall, their comments reflect generally apositive opinionabout the college, emphasizing its strong teaching quality, supportive faculty, and conducive learning environment. Students appreciate the institution's focus on practical knowledge, skill development, and friendly interaction between teachers and learners. The infrastructure and peaceful campus atmosphere are also highlighted as significant strengths. With these positive signs, the college appears to provide a nurturing and effective environment for academic and personal growth, earning praise and loyalty from its students.

While most respondents' express satisfaction with the college, some constructive feedback points to areas for improvement, such as Suggestions to improve laboratory facilities and integrate technology (like projector-based teaching) in classrooms were highlighted. They request for more practical-based learning opportunities to complement theoretical concepts. By addressing these issues, the college can significantly enhance the satisfaction and learning experience of its students in future.

Conclusion:
